15 schools entered the second Leicester Schools' League competition.

Hazel-street Board School team won the Leicester Schools' League, and were awarded Mr. I. Seddons' championship medals for the second season in succession. They lost only one match, and drew two. In league matches they have obtained 42 points out of a possible 46, scoring 120 goals against 18. Besides league matches they played ten friendlies, winning all of them, and finishing up with the following splendid record: Played 33, won 30, lost 1, drawn 2; goals for 191, against 21. The principal scorers were H. Barratt, A. Barratt, King, Gibbins, and Turner.

Runners-up, King Richard's-road School FC, were presented with Mr J McRobie's silver cup. Of the 22 League matches played they won 18 lost 2 drawn 2, goals, scoring 113 goals, and conceding 38. They were the only team to beat Hazel-street and drew the return match.

F. Martin (captain) who represented the school in all "Leicester Boys" matches and captained the Rest of the League team against the Champion, scored 53 goals.

Curzon-street and Syston-street both withdrew from the League during the season.

Additional Information

OXFORD-STREET BOARD SCHOOL.—With the object of promoting a strong football club in connection with the Schools' League, a lantern entertainment was given in Oxford-street School on Tuesday evening by Mr. R. W. Harvey, the headmaster. Pictures illustrative of the life and scenery in Sweden, including Stockholm, the Trothattan Canal and Falle, the lakes, Nääs, with its Sloyd training college and neighbourhood, were first thrown upon the screen. Then followed street scenes in Antwerp and Brussels, depicting the dog labour there, the chief public buildings, views of Dinant, and the Ardennes generally, all from photographs taken by Mr. Harvey. The concluding portion consisted of photographs of the animals in the Zoological Gardens, London, and slides of the children in their fancy dress costumes, as at the last Abbey Park fête. Thus a pleasant hour and a half was spent. Other entertainments of a similar character will be given during the winter.

HEALTH OF LEICESTER.—The Officer of Health for the borough reports that during the week ending 6th October, being the 40th of the year, there were registered 131 births. The deaths, after correction for those occurring in public institutions, numbered 39, showing a decrease of 18 as compared with the corresponding week of 1893. Of these deaths 14 were infants under one year of age, as against 17 in the same week of the previous year. There was one death from a common infectious disease, viz., erysipelas. Three deaths were caused by diarrhoea, corresponding with the same week of the previous year. Four deaths were referred to acute lung diseases, and seven to pulmonary consumption. Forty-two fresh cases of infectious disease were reported during the week, viz.: 35 scarlet fever, two typhoid, one diphtheria, and four erysipelas. Three inquests were reported, of which one was a death by violence. Fifteen patients were admitted into the Fever Hospital, 12 were discharged, leaving 71 under treatment in the wards of that institution on October 4, consisting of 70 scarlet fever patients, and one smallpox.
