# **Birmingham Senior Cup 1895-96**

Fixture congestion meant that 6 out of the 8 round 1 ties were played on Mondy afternoons. Most of the ties went with form, the one surprise seeing Stourbridge, who progressed from the Qualifying Competition, overcome Second Division strugglers Burslem Port Vale at Amblecote. Two non-Football League clubs met at West Bromwich Road, Walsall edging past the Birmingham and District League club, Singers. There was an unusual fixture clash in Burton, where, despite it being a Monday afternoon, Burton Swifts' clash with Leicester Fosse at Peel Croft kicked off at 12.15 in order that spectators could also take in the Second Division fixture between Burton Wanderers and Loughborough at Derby Turn later the same afternoon. Derby found themselves paired with Burton Wanderers for the third successive season, and fielded their first XI and were comfortable winners against the Second Division opponents, who had conceded home advantage for a cash inducement of £25 plus half the gate. As this amounted to £143 it proved to be a financially sound move. County reinstated their reserve team for the Round 2 tie with Stourbridge and a respectable turnout of 2,000 saw a straightforward 4-1 victory.

Leicester Fosse lost to Burton in their first-ever match in the competition. Two other newcomers Sheffield Wednesday and United won their Round 1 ties against Small Heath and Wolverhampton Wanderers, respectively. Wednesday took Aston Villa to extra time in Round 2, before losing out to an odd goal in seven. Sheffield United's visit to Walsall attracted a gate of 5,000, yet later the same week barely 200 people attended the game between Second division rivals Loughborough ad Walsall on a Wednesday afternoon.

Both semi-finals ended 2-0 with Sheffield United overcoming Derby County at a neutral Olive Grove in front of 4,000 spectators, with Villa's win over Burton Swifts barely attracting 1,000 at Wellington-road.

The Final at Wellington-road was blighted by dreadful weather, with Aston Villa comfortably overcoming Sheffield United 3-0, with the Blades England goalkeeper "Fatty" Foules playing a splendid game.

#### **BIRMINGHAM CUP MATCH AT LOUGHBOROUGH**

Loughborough played off their tie in the first round of the Birmingham Senior Cup with Long Eaton Rangers at Loughborough on Saturday, before about 2,000 spectators. Swift, the captain, took his place in the team after three weeks' rest, but he was not thoroughly fit to play, and before the game was many minutes old, he limped badly. For some time, matters were even, each side working very hard. The superiority of the home men manifested itself, and Ward scored a good goal, other openings being thrown away through weak and erratic kicking. Long Eaton played very pluckily indeed, and were worthy foemen of the "Luffs", but their shooting was at fault and at the interval Loughborough led by a goal to none. The play in the second half was of a poor description all round. Loughborough pressed immediately upon the resumption, and Clark put in a grand shot, Fulwood clearing, while his return struck the post, and another from Smith was well kept out. This proved the best bit of play in the game, the forwards giving a very miserable display afterwards. The result was a narrow victory for Loughborough by one goal to none. The most conspicuous feature of the game was the persistent rough play of Dakin, the visitors' right half-back. Geary and Fairbrother played well for Long Eaton, and Ward was the best forward on the Loughborough side. *Athletic News – 20 January 1896* 

**Burton Swifts v Leicester Fosse** – On Peel Coft yesterday. The Swifts left out Sorley and Dewey, and Fosse made experiments. No goals were scored in the ordinary time, and an extra half-hour was played. the Swifts then played a wonderfully improved game, scoring twice in five minutes. #### THE BIRMINGHAM CUP.

WRST BROMWICH ALBION V. WOLVER-HAMPTON WANDERERS.—Played at Perry Barr, in the presence of a large attendance. Though the Albion had the best of the play, Miller scored early for the Wolves, and Tonks putting on another, the Wanderers led at half-time by 2 goals to nil. On resuming Wolverhampton put on a third point, and the final result was: Wolverhampton Wanderers, 3 goals; West Bromwich Albion, nil.

WALSALL V. DERBY COUNTY.-Played at Leicester. Griffin scored for Walsall five minutes after the commencement, while Taggart registered a second, and at half-time Walsall led by 2 goals to nil. On resuming play was even, and each side scored once, the final result being: Walsall, 3 goals; Derby County, 1.

BIRMINGHAM CUP FINAL. ASTON VILLA v. SHEFFIELD UNITED. At Perry Barr. Aston Villa kicked off before about 5000 spectators. The opening exchanges were all in favour of the Villa, John Cowan scoring after twelve minutes' play. From a good centre by John Cowan, Cain put the ball through his own goal. The game continued in favour of the home team, Foulkes saving several attacks finely. At half time the Villa led by 3 goals to nil. In the second half the Villa continued to have the best of the play, but the game deteriorated greatly in quality, and there was some very scrambling work on both sides. A blinding storm of sleet swept over the ground and made good play out of the question. An offside goal fell to the United, but there was no doubt as to its illegitimacy. Result—Aston Villa, 3 goals; Sheffield United, nil.
