#1 BURTON WANDERERS v. LEICESTER FOSSE. At Burton last, night, before 2.000 spectators. The first half was of a fairly even nature. King netted the ball for Burton, but the point was disallowed owing to the custodian having been impeded. On resuming Watkins scored for Leicester with long shot, which Taft ought have stopped. Five minutes from the close Salt allowed himself to be charged with the ball in his possession, with the result that Cotton equalised. Result:

Result: - Wanderers, one goal, to Fosse none. Played at Burton, before two thousand spectators, in beautiful weather. The game was well contested throughout, nothing being registered in the first half., but in the

second the Wanderers had much the best of the play, and Dyke scored the only goals of the match. Saer and Taft kept goals splendidly, while Sellers was the means of the Wanderers goal.

#4 BASS CHARITY CUP FINAL BURTON SWIFTS v BURTON WANDERERS

There were 5,000 spectators to witness the deciding tie for this trophy at Burton yesterday. The Wanderers played up well and held their own until ten minutes from the interval, when Halton opened the Swifts' account. Nothing further was scored until the second half was well advanced, when Hamilton put on another for the Swifts. who won by two goals to none. *London Evening Standard – 28 April 1898*
