Derby County and WBA were awarded byes until the quarter-finals. All Round 1 games were played on Mondays. Leicester were trounced 8-1 at Hilary-street, Walsall, barely a week after the Second Division rivals met in a League fixture which the Fosse came out victorious 4-1. In another all Second Division tie, Burton Swifts shared 4 goals with Small Heath. In the replay 5 weeks later, the Heathens romped home 7-1. At the Athletic Grounds, Loughborough, the Luffs and Burton Wanderers drew. The replay at Burton which Wanderers won 6-0 was demoted to a friendly due the non-appearance of the officials. To add insult to injury Loughborough won the replay 2-0. Villa travelled to Worcester where they easily overcame Berwick Rangers.

The quarter-final ties were played over a 5 week period. Brierley Hill and Walsall drew after 90 minutes. Walsall refused to play extra time and Brierley Hill took to the pitch and scored an unopposed goal to claim the match. The Cup committee disagreed and ordered a replay, with Brierley again having home advantage, but this time Walsall easily won 4-1. Albion beat Aston Villa 2-1 in front of 5,000 spectators on a Monday afternoon, and were the only club too beat the Villa twice in their double-winning season. In the remaining two ties, First Division clubs overcame Second Division clubs.

Walsall were surprise winners at Filbert-street, beating favourites Derby County, to set up a final against Wolverhampton Wanderers who had comfortably beaten WBA 3-0 at Wellington-street, Perry Barr. Walsall beat Wolverhampton Wanderers the final, also staged at Perry Barr, 2-1.

#5 LOUGHBOROUGH v BURTON WANDERERS – Played at Loughborough. Through a mischance Berry let in Lumdsen, who scored in the first ten minutes. After leading at the interval Buton conceded a corner, which finely placed by Hardy, enabled Loughborough to equalise. The teams were evenly matched. Result: Loughborough 1 goal; Burton Wanderers 1 goal. *South Wales News* – 15 December 1896

#6 WALSALL v LEICESTER FOSSE – This contest in the first round of the Birmingham cup was played in shocking weather at Walsall. Both teams put in their full strength. The visitors made an excellent start, scoring twice in the first three minutes. Then Walsall played up and keeping their opponents continuously at work, were leading at half-time by five goals to two. Continuing to hold the advantage, Walsall in the second half increased their score by three goals, whilst Leicester beat the home custodian once, the final result being: Walsall, eight goals; Leicester Fosse, three. *London Evening Standard – 8 December 1896*

#9 BURTON WANDERERS v LOUGHBOROUGH – Played at Burton yesterday before a good attendance. Owing to the absence of the referee it was decided to play a friendly game. In the first half Flannagan, Arkesden and Lumsden (twice) scored for the Wanderers, Thompson giving his opponents another by putting it through his own goal. After the interval Loughborough improved but Flannagan added another, Burton Wanderers winning by 6 goals to Loughborough none. *Yorkshire Post and Leeds Intelligencer – 29 December 1897*

#11 DERBY COUNTY v. LOUGHBOROUGH. This match played on the Rosehill Ground yesterday in cold and seasonable weather, and in the presence of a big crowd. The home club had a fairly strong side. The ground was rather dangerous in consequence of the frost. Derby won the toss, and once made tracks for the visitors' goal, which was captured early in the game. After this the match was splendidly contested, but the stubborn play of the Rams told its tale, and they succeeded in notching a second point. Midfield play followed after this, but Derby were the aggressors and Goodall once more led the van. The visitors beat them back, but it was only momentarily, the homesters came again and added a further point. The fast going of Derby was such as to completely run the Luffs off their feet and after a further bombardment the fourth point came to the Peakites. The Loughborough strove hard to notch a point, but failure resulted, and Derby won somewhat easily four goals to nil.
