There was a minor change to League rules for the 1893-94 season - every player had to be registered with the secretary of the League 14 days before becoming eligible to play in a League match and that any player who takes part in 4 or more senior matches would be disqualified from further participation in League fixtures.

Ashby Albion joined the ten club League in 1893, ending the season at the bottom of the table, just one point less than Woodville who finished just above them in 9<sup>th</sup> position.

Coalville lost just two of their games to finish in 4<sup>th</sup> position.

Swadlincote won the title winning 14 out of 16 League games, and losing just 2. The previous season's champions Tutbury finished a creditable third just 3 points behind. Gresley Rovers were runners-up finishing one place higher than in 1892-93.

In February 1894 the Executive Committee divided up the £2 2s forfeited by Tamworth Tow Swifts by their failure to complete the previous season's fixtures as follows: Tutbury 14s, Coalville 12s, Woodville 12s and Gresley Rovers 4s.

Swadlincote made a protest against their match with Tutbury being awarded to the latter club on the ground of the wrong decisions and incompetency of the referee. According to the referee's verdict, the game played at Tutbury on Boxing Day, the home team won by three goals to one. Mr George Poyser on behalf of Swadlincote contended that the referee(Mr T Whitebread) lost them the match by a mistake he admitted having made in giving the first goal to Tutbury – at a time when Swadlincote were leading 1 goal to 0 and were having all the best of the play; and that he was so upset by what he had done that he was not fit to take any further part in the match. Mr Poyser also declared that on the goal being allowed, he protested not only against the decision, but against the game being counted as a League game. The officiating linesman, Mr Ben Hull, corroborated Mr Poyser's evidence as to the unfitness of the referee. Mr J Jones (Tutbury) admitted that the first goal allowed to Tutbury was not a fair one, but submitted that his club won

the match according to the referee's decision, and that it must stand. The referee's report next read—Mr. Whitehead being unable to attend owing to the illness of his wife—and in it he stated that his first decision was a wrong one, the ball going quite three feet outside, and giving as his reason that he was "fluttered" at the time. In his opinion, however, both the other goals were legitimate ones, and he did not consider he ought to be held responsible for the effect of a wrong decision upon the play of the Swadlincote team. Mr. Poyser protested to him against the first goal, but not against the game being considered a League game. After careful consideration the League Executive declared that: "In the first place, the Tutbury club were very much to blame in not taking proper steps to secure the appointment of a referee in accordance with Rule 13, and fined them 2s. 6d. on that account; secondly, as the referee who did officiate was sent by the secretary of the League, and was the League list, they cannot under the English football rules, and after taking the opinion of one of the highest authorities—to whom all the circumstances were explained captained—upon the subject, though sympathising to the fullest extent with the Swadlincote club, do other confirm his decision that the match was won by Tutbury." The Executive subsequently decided that for the future all breaches of the rules regarding the appointment of referee that come under their notice will involve the infliction of the specified punishment.

Ashy Albion and Woodville were re-elected at the League's AGM in July 1894. The vacancy caused by Gresley Swifts' resignation, for which Whitwick Town, Hugglescote and Burton Swifts Reserves applied, was after a ballot filled by the Derbyshire team.

Tutbury were allowed to keep the championship flag they won the previous season and that another one was awarded to Swadlincote.

## BURTON JUNIOR FOOTBALL LEAGUE

The adjourned annual general meeting of the above was held on Thursday week at the Riffeman Iun, Mr. E.Sharratt in the chair. After the minutes had been read and confirmed, Mr. Sharratt (the treasurer) gave his statement, which showed the League to be working very estisfactority. The next business related to a championship flag, and it was decided that Tutbury should keep the one held by them, and that another one be awarded to Swadliscote. The election of clubs was then proceeded with, Ashby Albion and Woodville, the retiring clubs, being received without a ballot, thus leaving only one vacancy (caused by Gresley Swifts' resignation), for which Whitwick Town, Hugglescote, and Burton Swifts Reserve applied, the ballot resulting in favour of the latter club. The election of officials resulted in the president, vice presidents, hon. treasurer, and hon. secretary being re-elected, and the following gentlemen for Executive Committee: Messra. S. Black, G. B. Capes, J.T. Sharpe, and the hon. secretary and hon. treasurer. Gresley Rovers moved an alteration to Rule 7, respecting players taking part in senior matches, but this was rejected. The Tutbury and Coalville clubs moved a new rule, providing that all referees be appointed by the Executive Committee, and this was carried unanimously. St. Paul's brought forward a motion re "posching," but, as proper notice had not been given, it was not gone into. Greeley Rovers moved an alteration to Rule 12, respecting charges for admission, and after some discussion this was agreed to. A vote of thanks to the chairman and the past season's officials closed the meeting.
