# Hugglescote Robin Hood v Winshill

These team met in the first round of the Gresley Charity Cup on Garner's Ground, Hugglescote yesterday (Boxing Day). Winshill won the toss and elected to play down hill, the Robins starting the game in the presence of a goodly number of spectators. The home team pressed for some time, several corners being awarded them but they all proved fruitless. One of the visitors deliberately punched the ball and a penalty kick was given against them. Rice took the kick, but Rocxxer, the visitors' custodian smartly saved. The Robins kept up their pressure and secured a number of corners, but half-time arrived with a clean sheet:

Soon after the restart, Rice got away, passed to Reed and J. Smith opened the score with a splendid shot. Later on H. Smith scored another goal for the homesters, but it was ruled offside by the referee. The visiting backs defended grandly, the result being that the Robins were unable to increase their score. W. Smith and Moore sent in some fine shots, which just went over the crossbar, and when the time arrived the score stood:

At Gresley, in rough and wintry weather, 2,000 spectators being present. Playing with the sun behind them, Gresley caused Barnes to handle, and each custodian dealt with good shots, the game being ragged. At half-time nothing was scored. During the second portion each team had hard lines. Gresley missing a good chance, but no goals being registered. The result was a pointless draw, and the game will have to be replayed. Final:-

#### **FINAL TIE**
