Twelve teams - Anstey Town, Belgrave Granville, Belgrave St Michael's, Carr Brothers, Craven, King Richard's Road, Leicester Wanderers, London-Road, North End, Oxford Rovers, South Wigston and St Mary's Rovers - entered the inaugural Leicester & District League competition. All but two teams – Anstey Town and South Wigston – were based in Leicester.

The first matches took place on Saturday 7 September.

All games in December were ordered to commence no later than 2.45 pm.

Several teams – Belgrave Granville, London-road, and Leicester Wanderers withdrew from the competition before the end of the season.

Press coverage was poor. In a typical week only one or two results were published, along with brief reports of league committee meetings, which in general were concerned with rearranging games, fining teams for non-attendance, organising replays and announcing the appointment of referees.

The League was dominated by two clubs – Anstey Town and South Wigston – with only a single point separating them at the end of the season. It therefore seems fitting that Anstey Town clinched the title on the final day of the season after beating South Wigston at home in the "Championship decider". At the start of the day South Wigston headed the table on 24 points, just one point ahead of Anstey. Given that South Wigston had a far superior goal average (3.7 cf. 1.6), they only had to avoid defeat to clinch the championship. It is also worth noting that prior to this game South Wigston had only conceded 15 goals in 15 games The match report is given below:

SOUTH WIGSTON v ANSTEY TOWN

Considerable interest was attached to this match, the result of which settled the championship of the League. There was a large attendance of spectators, a large number

arriving from Wigston. South Wigston had to face a strong wind, and Anstey made the most of the running, but could not get past Crook. Jones made a fine individual run for Wigston nearly the length of the ground, his final shot striking the bar – exceedingly hard lines – whilst Harrison had several times to save awkward shots. After half an hour's play Anstey drew first blood from a free kick well taken by Thomas, whilst the same player scored a second with a capital shot just after. Crooks having saved by giving a corner, Thomas beat him and scored Anstey's third point. Wigston were within an ace of scoring from a well-placed free, but Mr Gardner ruled that the ball was put through before Bridgeford, who had followed up well, headed it. In the second half Wigston applied almost continuous pressure. Harrison and the backs defending well. The visitor's forwards, however, were very erratic in their movements, only Bridgeford and Jones doing themselves justice. Onions notched a point for Wigston, nicely heading on from "Galley's" centre, but Anstey responded with another point from a fine free by Inglesant, the shot being sent through by Willet. Result:

The wooden spoon went to Oxford Rovers on 6 points. The bottom three sides Oxford Rovers, Carr Bros and North End each won three of their 16 games, the difference between them being the number of drawn games.

The Champions (Anstey) v Rest of the League match was played at Filbert-street prior to the Fosse v Stoke game. Caps were given to players appearing for the Rest of the League, whilst suitably inscribed medals were presented to the Anstey team at the end of the match.

Enderby Town, Leicester YMCA, Leicester Belvoir and Syston Swifts were formally invited to join the Leicester & District League for 1896-7 season.

Leicester & District League stated in April 1896 that they would start a cup competition for the 1896-7 season.

The Championship Flag presented to Anstey was provided by Mr Seddon.

At the League's first AGM on Wednesday 13 may at the Victoria Coffee House, Leicester, it was decided that the league would comprise 12 clubs in 1896-97, namely – Anstey, South Wigston, Craven, Belgrave St Michael's, King Richard's-road, Oxford Rovers, Leicester North End, St Mary's – who were all re-elected; Syston swifts, Enderby Granite and Leicester Emmanuel were also elected as new members. This left one vacancy that they would fill before the end of the month.

Teams chosen from the two leagues met at Moira before a large gate. Leicester started with a strong wind behind them and pressed. The home contingent retaliated and play ruled even. An offside against the home team prevented a score. Ridgway, for the home team, scored after 25 minutes. The visitor's' left wing was dangerous, but Holbrooke cleared well, and soon after the same player was penalised, for carrying. After the interval the home side pressed, and forced two corners, which were cleared. He visiting backs were working hard, and kept the home forwards from scoring. Harrison for the visitors, was fouled for carrying, but cleared well. The home side continued the pressure, but failed to get through. Lenton scored

from a foul, but the ball went through without being played the second time. Just before time Dennis scored from a centre by Coe. Result:

ASHBY LEAGUE, two goals LEICESTER LEAGUE, none. Leicester Daily Post – 10 February 1896

Anstey Town, the Champions of the Leicester and District League, met the Rest of the League on the Fosse ground on Saturday. Anstey were soon placed on the defensive, their opponents playing a spirited but none too scientific game. Gradually the game became more even, but the backs on both sides were too keen on the ball to allow much shooting. Tomlin for the Rest, got in one splendid centre, and later was rather unlucky in being fouled just as he repeated this feat. Half-time came with no score. The scratch team displayed a little more combination in the second half, and, after several minutes; pressure, Harrison, who was playing none too confidently in goal, unnecessarily gave a corner, from which Bridgford scored. Shortly afterwards from a free kick, Smith placed the ball through his own goal, and not far from the finish, Bridgford again scored from a corner. Noting else of importance occurred, and a moderate game ended in a victory for the league by three goal to none.

Champion medals were presented to: Harrison (goal); Smith and Wolse (backs); J Cresswell, W Cresswell and Cufflin (half-backs); Smart, Inglesant, North and Willett and another (forwards). Rest of the League: Ward (goals); j Monk, and J Sibson (backs); Baxter, H Bolsover and Hunt (half-backs), Curtis, Burton, Buswell, Bridgford and Tomlin (forwards). Referee, Mr F Gardner.

Additional Information

FORMATION OF LEAGUES .- The Association proceeded to consider the report of the committee re the proposed North Leicestershire League, Ashby and District League, and Leicester Junior League. The Secretary stated that the committee had gone carefully through the rules, and subject to certain alterations they recommended the Association to give their sanction to their formation. The chief alterations were in regard to the radius of the Leagues, as the committee had to guard against any clubs being left out in the cold by being sandwiched between the areas covered by leagues. In the North Leicestershire League there were eight clubs entered. and the committee recommended that the radius be 10 miles from Loughborough instead of nine. In the Ashby and District League, which had 10 clubs entered, the committee recommended that the radius be extended to eight miles.—The Association gave their sanction to the formation of Leagues, with these and certain other minor alterations.—The Leicester Junior League proposed to include 13 clubs, amongst which were Enderby, Anstey, and South Wigston.—The committee felt that 13 clubs were too many, and that the League should be confined to purely town clubs. three country clubs named were admitted clubs in the Hinckley district which have had fixtures with them up to the present time would have a difficulty in future seasons in arranging matches. If there was a desire on the part of Anstey, South Wigston, and Enderby to have a League there was nothing to prevent them throwing in their lot with the clubs in the Hinckley district for that purpose.

—The Association by 11 votes to five endorsed the committee's opinion, and confined the League to Leicester clubs only.

A meeting of the Emergency Committee was held at the Victoria Coffee House on Monday evening. Mr. F. Gardner presiding. There were also present Mr. T. Sampson. H. Bramley, and F. London-road, on November 23rd, 12 minutes' short time was played, but it was ordered to stand as a League match. Leicester Craven reported Belgrave St. Michael's for playing J. Johnson, he being a professional for Hinckley Town. Sufficient evidence not being forthcoming, the hon. secretary of the League was instructed to make further inquiries into the matter.— Carr Brothers, Belgrave St. Michael's, and St. Mary's Rovers were fined 1s. for not starting their games according to the ru'es of the League. It was decided that all League matches for December start at 2.45.—North End reported Oxford Rovers for not making sufficient arrangements to keep the spectators off the playing field in their match last Saturday, and the match was ordered to be re-played on Dec. 14.
