Leicester Town League 1898-99

Winner:ImperialRunner-up:Belgrave United

The Town League was for "minor" clubs based in Leicester.

Local newspapers gave little coverage to this competition.

The Town League was split into two Districts – North and South. The winners of the North and South Districts played a Championship decider at the end of the season.

At the April 1899 meeting of the Management Committee of the Leicester Town League held at the Victoria Coffee House:

- The Hon. Secretary reported that the Oxford Victoria v Humberstone-road PM league match on 1 April was stopped 30 minutes from time, owing to the ball bursting, the score then reading Oxford 2 goals, Humberstone-road PM. None. The game was ordered to be replayed on 29 April. Oxford Victoria to pay the expenses of the Humberstone-road team, failing which the match to stand as a win for Oxford by two goals to none.
- Oxford Victoria reported that St Saviour's FC failed to turn up on Saturday 8 April t replay the League match stopped by inclement weather on 21 January, the score in that match standing at one to none in favour of Oxford at the time of abandonment. St Saviour's secretary pleaded that he was unable to raise a team, but admitted that he dd not inform the Oxford secretary until too late to prevent the Oxford team and the referee from taking the field. It was decided that the St Saviour's FC must pay Oxford FC 2s 6d for marking out the ground, 1s cost of dressing room and half expenses of the Oxford Victoria FC visiting them. Oxford Victoria were ordered to pay the referee; the result of 21 January was ordered to stand.
- Hon. Secretary reported that D Oldham and H Bunn(Cumberland FC), S Whiteman (Sanvey-gate) and G Atherley (Rutland FC) did not turn up to play for the Rest of League v Belgrave United on 25 March, nor had any notifications before that date or since been received by the League Secretary. The Sanvey-gate FC secretary attended, and tendered an explanation which was accepted; the other three who did not appear) were fined 1s each and debarred from taking place in the Town League football util the fine was paid,





NORTH v SOUTH

This match was played on the St Matthew' Vicarage FC ground, Green-lane, on Monday morning before 500 spectators, including a fair sprinkling of ladies. Councillor E | Yearby (president of the League) kicked off for the North, who had lost the toss, and had the face the slope and a rather high wind. H Randall scored the first for the South, with a shot which gave Greenough no chance. Both Wright and Pegg were playing a grand game against the wind, and they were well supported by the halves. The North forward went up the field in a body, and Knight fell in an attempt to prevent them dribbling through, but did not get the ball away, the scores thus coming level. The South forwards were well fed by big kicks from the backs, and hereabouts Wright, missing his kick, et in Rudkin, who banged the ball through. Half-time: South, two, North, one. The second half was more evenly contested, Bentley and Turner making some splendid bursts up the wing, for the South, as did Cree and Bryan for the North. Platt was working like a Trojan in the centre, his energy being rewarded by a lovely goal. Tomlinson, getting the ball from the kick-off, raced up the touch line, and sent in a beautiful shot, the ball ging just under the crossbar in the corner, Greenough had a few minutes hard work to do, but dealt with some teasers in a very cool manner, the North encouraged by shous of their supporters, now got going again, the South defenders having a very uncomfortable time of it. On one occasion it looked all over a goal for the North, but Knight threw himself all his length, and just stopped the ball from rolling through. The North forwards, who were very smart in following up swarmed round him, but after a severe tussle be managed to get the ball away. The North were not to be denied, however, forcing several corners, one of which Ward received on his toe, and through a crowd of players put the ball in the et, bringing the scores level once more. LEICESTER TOWN LEAGUE BELGRAVE UITED v IMPERIAL

This was the closing match in the above League's programme, and took place on the Fosse club's ground, as a curtain-raiser to the more serious business of the Midland League match. Both clubs have played consistently good football in their class throughout the season, and for to-days' encounter both clubs had their best sides up. There was only a moderate attendance at kick-off. Consequent of the early start. The weather was fine, but threatening, and he ground soon worked itself into a dreadfully holding condition. Promptly to time. Belgrave kicked off, and a couple of runs down ended in nothing, Chapman sending them back. The opening play was rather tame, but after the players had found their feet somewhat, the Imperial made strong running, and kept the game almost wholly in Belgrave's half. Thacker was proving himself a bit useful on the left wing for Imperial and to in several short runs and shots in Greenhough's xxxxx, but the Belgrave goalkeeper was seldom troubled, so what shots didn't go behind, Roberts generally interposed, until at length a nasty handful to clear from the feet of Squires caused Greenhough to be on his mettle, and which the defence came forth triumphant. After a visit to each end, a bit of capital combination by the Imperial forwards was justly rewarded, as after a short passing movement up the field, Rosevear at last sent in a capital ground shot, which gave them the lead. The Belgrave lot played up somewhat better after this reverse, the left wing getting down twice I quick succession, but shooting outside. Fairly even play followed up to half-time. Which arrived with the score:

IMPERIAL, one goal;

BELGRAVE UNITED, none.

Imperial started the second half, but were quickly robbed of the ball by Archer and Belgrave paid a momentary visit to their opponents' half. Morley was not long in kicking over to his forwards, however, and a sharp run down by Thacker and Wakefield led to a corner being eventually conceded on the other wing. Belgrave cleared away the flag kick, but they were soon on the defensive again, and from a bit of a melee in front of goal Johnson shot in, Greenhough having no chance whatever to save. This put the "Imps" on good terms with themselves, who no doubt could see the gold "centre-bits" in their possession, but the game was not yet won. Belgrave ran down from the centre kick, but Chapman soon transferred play, which again settled down in Belgrave's half for some little tie. Butts at length enlivened proceedings somewhat with a tussle with Goodwin, and emerging with the ball at his toes, he was enabled to shoot for goal. Hollowood cleared but was called on twice in quick succession, and before he recovered himself Durrad headed a sharp return into the net. Belgrave again got down by the aid of the right wing, Barrows putting behind. This

was followed by a bit of extremely good combination by the Imperial forwards, and hereabouts the game enlivened up considerably, play concentrating in interesting fashion round the Belgrave goal. A goal kick eventually brought the needed relief for Belgrave, whose forwards got away, and Bowles, running strongly, finished up by sending in a stinging hot at Greenhough, the last-named throwing away in good style. After xx Imperial had been at the other end, Belgrave came again, and Barrows banged in a straight shot, which Greenhough turned up to the cross-bar, but Barrows rushed up and breasted the ball int the net, thus making the scores level. Both sides strove their utmost to get the winning point, but no-side was sounded with the result:
