It will then be seen that all the home clubs in this division sustained defeat.

In the second division Quorn Havelock went to Hemington, and; won by three goals to one; Anstey Town beat Ratby Swifts, at Anstey, by three goals to two.

Since last season the Quorn Havelock have been weakened considerably through several members joining neighbouring clubs and others leaving the village. However, a fair team was sent off to Hemington, and they acquitted themselves very creditably. The forwards played a good game, the goals being scored by A, Wykes, T. Barwell and A. Clarke. #### **#52 LEICESTERSHIRE SHIELD COMPETITION FINAL**

##### **FLECKNEY v LEICESTER CLARENCE**

The final of the Leicestershire Shield competition was played on the Kibworth ground, before 900 spectators, the contesting teams being Fleckney and Leicester Clarence. Fleckney played their full strength, but the Leicester men had to substitute Kank for Ward in goal on account of illness. During the initial stages of the first half play was fairly even, but later on A. Garner scored for Fleckney when close in, the goalkeeper miskicking at an easy shot. Fleckney had the best of the exchanges after this but failed to score, and half-time arrived with one point to none in favour of Fleckney. After about fifteen minutes A. Garner notched the second point for Fleckney from a penalty kick, the goalkeeper having no chance of effecting a save. The game resolved itself into one of very moderate character, and as neither side could again score the end came with a victory for Fleckney. Result:
