



Leicestershire Challenge Shield 1895-96

Winner: Leicester Belvoir-street
Runner-Up: Swannington St George's
No. of entries: 55

Derbyshire was represented by two clubs – Overseal Town and Swannington St George's.

The clubs were divided into six divisions for the first three rounds.

The Shield competition had the following residential qualification: *"That a player, who is a householder and residing in any other village than in which the club is situate, is NOT eligible for the Shield Competition."*

F. Ainsworth, of Kegworth FC was suspended from playing football for three weeks for abusive language towards the referee in a Shield match at Kegworth on 19 October.

Hathern were fined 2s for failing to send the result of the game to the secretary of the Association.

Leicester Belvoir-street beat Swannington St George's at Anstey to become the first Leicester club to win the competition.

Match Reports

A selection of published match reports.

#1 FOOTBALL SHIELD TIE – Measham Rangers Reserves and Bagworth Ivanhoe met on Saturday in the first round of the Shield Competition, the game ending in favour of the home team, whose superior weight told against their lighter, but more tricky opponents. Read, the Bagworth goalkeeper, saved some excellent shots, whilst G Barrs and R Bale were the most conspicuous of the forwards. For Measham Hart did not shine as a goalkeeper, and he was responsible for many corners which ought not to have been conceded. The shooting of the Measham forwards was most erratic and they missed chance after chance. Peach,

Bradford and Dennis made a fair trio, and pope was perhaps the best of the two backs. Final score – Bagworth three goals; Measham, two goals.

#6 CASTLE DONINTON PSA RESERVES v BELTON

THE PSA Reserves met Belton village (in the Leicestershire Shield) in a field close to Castle Donington station, but owing to the counter attraction of the League match there was a very small number of spectators. The visitors who lacked any science whatever, were completely outclassed by the Dons, who eventually ran out easy winners by 11 goals to one.

#7 HATHERN VICTORIA ROVERS v BARROW EXCELSIOR

Played on the Victoria ground, Hathern, on Saturday afternoon, before a moderate attendance. The visitors winning the toss, the ball was set in motion by A Thompson, the visitors immediately making a rush for the home goal. After a spell of mid-field play, a corner was conceded the Barrow players, as the outcome of which the ball was placed between the posts, but the referee disallowed the point for offside. Hathern now got possession, and B Mitchell made a splendid run on the left. A corner resulted from a throw-in, and Hathern should have scored. Give-and-take play was now the order, till W Roper was conspicuous, and scored the first goal for Hathern. Although this around the visitors, the Reserves was pressed and several corners fell to them. Eventually the goal-post was struck, and the ball rebounding in front, Berrington forced it through and added the second goal for the Reserves. Barrow now made the game lively, and tried to improve their chances, the Hathern goal being in danger for a time. Halftime: Hathern, two goals; Barrow none. On the re-start, play was decidedly in favour of the Excelsior, who obtained a foul in front, which was followed by two corners in quick succession. Immediately following this the visitors made a splendid run, and certainly should have scored. Hathern now acted somewhat on the defensive, and the visitors were not able to pass the backs, who played a good game. The end came with the score standing:

#33 Mountsorrel Castle played Hathern Victoria, at Hathern, in the second round of the Shield competition. Castle had not full strength, playing three reserves. Hathern won the toss and kicked against the wind. A. Bowler soon scored from a corner kick, and directly after Inglesant did ditto from a free, close in. In the second half Hathern pressed during the first quarter of a hour, and scored, as the wind was very strong. Afterwards the game was more open, and Palmer scored with a low cross shot. The game ended; Castle three goals; Hathern, one. Lovett, in goal, played a splendid game, while Mawby and Bowler kicked finely. *Mowbray Mercury and Oakham and Uppingham News – 7 November 1895*

At Melton. Much to the surprise of the visitors they were excelled at all points of the game, and the match ended in a runaway victory for Melton. In the first half two goals were scored, and chances innumerable missed, but after the interval six more were added. Syston never got within shooting range, though they were much the heavier team, and the final score was:

#41 BELVOIR-STREET SS v CLARENCE

On the latter's ground, Clarence won the toss and played with the wing, and soon scored from a free kick. Play became fast but no further scoring took place in the first half. On resuming Belvoir bombarded their enemy's goal, but could not score for some time, several times just missing. At length Jarvis scored, the ball grazing the cross bar as it went through. Final score:

#44 FOOTBALL - St Mary's Victor played Kibworth in the second round of the Shield Competition at Kibworth on Saturday, before a good gate. Kibworth started well, scoring two goals in the first ten minutes. St Mary's then played up, and scored by Wheldon and Marson. Even play continued up to the interval, when the score was two all. St Mary's completely outplayed their opponents in the second half, scoring goals by Sutton, Marson and Wheldon, and a good game ended: St Mary's Victor, five goals' Kibworth, two goals.

#48 SWANNINGTON ST GEORGE'S v SILEBY RESERVES

This match was played at Swannington, on Saturday, and ended in a win for the home team by six goals to none. The Swannington players had the best of matters throughout, their goalkeeper not being called upon more than once throughout the game. Playing uphill in the first half, the Saints scored four points, whereas they could only score twice downhill, although pressing constantly. One of the Sileby players was ordered off the field for misconduct, but as this happened just before the finish, it could not have had much effect upon the game, as Sileby were undoubtedly outplayed from beginning to finish.

Swannington scored first, but Belvoir equalised in the next minute by Shingler. Belvoir had most of the game but missed several chances to score. Half-time, Belvoir, one goal; Swannington, one.

Resuming Belvoir played a most improved game, and pressed throughout this half. Jarvis scored the second goal and King added another, the "Swans" being completely outplayed.
