This 1878-79 season "was only the second the Loughborough Athletics Club had made football a part of their programme, and an investigation of their list of matches played shows very good result and taking into consideration the fact that last season nearly the whole of the team were "raw material" and with the exception of two or three members have never played a football match before, we think that the results are exceptionally good and creditable to all concerned, and that the material, tough "raw" was of the right quality. Nother fact worthy of notice to show the rapid improvement there has been, is that the first match last season was against the Grammar School and resulted in a rather easy victory for the latter; this season the Loughborough Football Club have defeated the Grammar School three times, and in one of their latter matches were only beaten by one goal by a first class team the Notts Forest Football Club. We hope that next season the club may be still more successful and that in time they may even aspire to, and win that prize, which all association football players desire (and which has narrowly escaped being taken off this season by our neighbours the Nottingham Forest Club), viz the Association Challenge Cup." - *Leicester Daily Post – 5 April 1879*
