Twelve clubs competed for the inaugural Loughborough & District League.

At the request of several clubs a Leicestershire Football Association commission of inquiry was held into the conduct of the Loughborough and District League in November 1896. They found that the League was being conducted in a questionable manner and they recommended the removal the secretary of the League, Mr G H Newton, who was also secretary of Loughborough Emmanuel FC, from his office. The commission recommended the following alterations to the League to remedy many of the causes of the complaints:

- Full meetings of the League to be held once a month to select referees and to transact any League business.
- "Proper" minute book to be kept of the League and the Emergency Committee and all transactions entered therein and signed by the chairman at each following meeting
- That the League should not permit any referee to officiate in matches of clubs of which he is or has been a member.
- That the League shall insist on clubs paying the referee's fees according to
 rule and any referee receiving anything in excess of this, and the club paying
 it, shall be deemed guilty of a serious breach of rules and dealt with
 accordingly.
- That the League shall give clubs protested against on any point whatever an
 opportunity of attending or stating in writing their defence, before any
 decision is arrived ay.

That the Emergency Committee if the League should at once see that a
proper set of books are precured and that registration and acknowledgment of registration of
players, according to rule, is strictly adhered to.

George Newton (21), secretary of both Loughborough Emmanuel and the League was convicted of fraud and sentenced to 6 months hard labour. Newspaper reports such as the one given below provides a fascinating insight into the role of football club secretaries:

George Harry Newton (21) clerk, Loughborough, was indicted for forging a receipt for the payment of £1 15s., with intent to defraud, and to a second indictment charging him with forging a receipt for 9s. 6d., with intent to defraud, he pleaded guilty. In the first case he denied the intention to defraud. — Mr. Magee, who appeared to prosecute, explained that prisoner had acted as secretary to a football club at Loughborough, and part of his duty was to hire brakes to convey the team when they had matches to play out of, town. A charge of 1s each person was made, and the deficiency was made good out of the club funds. Prisoner had forged a receipt for 30s. due to the owner of the brake, but by pleading that he had no intent to defraud, Newton probably meant that he intended to pay the money at some future time. — Newton intimated that he desired to be tried by the jury, and the plea was taken as one of not guilty. — Evidence in support of the charge was given by Thomas Webster, printer's apprentice, Loughborough, present secretary and treasurer of the Loughborough Emmanuel Football Club. Last October the team went to Hathern, and 10s. was collected from the members. In the following week they went to Bardon, and on each occasion witness, as treasurer, paid prisoner a sum of money from the club funds to make up the charge for the brake, which each week was 17s. 6d. At a subsequent meeting of the club Newton produced a bill from Messrs. John Moss and Son for £1 15s., purporting to have been receipted by "P. Moss." but at an inquiry into certain alleged irregularities prisoner admitted to witness that he had written the name himself. — Percy John Moss was called to prove that he did not sign the receipt produced. — Prisoner said he was guilty of the forgery, but he had no intention to defraud, as he had arranged with Mr. John Moss to pay the money back again. He had been out of work for 18 months, with a spell of illness, and he was really driven to take the money. — His Lordship, in his summing up, remarked that it was a very sad case, as prisoner was a young man. and so far as it was known, of good character. What he had said did not exonerate him, for he undoubtedly did forge the receipt and put the money into his own pocket. — The jury found him guilty, with a recommendation to mercy. — His Lordship said he was very sorry to see prisoner in this position, because it really seemed that he had borne a good character. But although the jury had recommended him to mercy, it would be very wrong of him (the Judge) to pass over these offences with a merely nominal penalty, because prisoner had been placed in a position of trust, which he had betrayed. He would he sentenced to six calendar months' hard labour on each indictment, the sentences to run concurrently. Leicester Chronicle – Saturday 20 February 1897

Following disorderly conduct by spectators in the League match between Woodhouse and Mountsorrel Castle at Woodhouse, on 20 March 1897, Leicester Football Association passed the following ruling: The ground of the Woodhouse Club was closed until 13 September 1897. Raynor (Woodhouse) was suspended until 8 October for abusive conduct towards the referee. The Woodhouse Club was ordered to pay the expenses of the referee and the Leicestershire Football Association Commission of Inquiry.



LOUGHBOROUGH AND DISTRICT LEAGUE HATHERN (CHAMPIONS) v REST OF LEAGUE

Played on the Athletic Ground, Loughborough, before about 600 spectators. Dr Phelps kicked off, and Hathern scored by J Vickers after three minutes, the ball striking the bar and going through. The game was very even for a while but eventually the League attacked. They were, however, weak in font of goal, and Hathern failed in a similar respect, several openings not being taken advantage of, though Baum made one or two nice shots. Half-time, Hathern one, Rest of League, none.

Curiously the second half opened in precisely similar fashion to the first, Hathern scoring in three minutes through T Randon after which they continued to press for a time Sutton defending well, kept his lines clear. The League had the best of matters, but the forwards did not combine well, and the Hathern backs had little difficulty to prevent them scoring. Close on time the League ought to have scored, a shot by Thomas just going outside. Result:
