Southampton reached the WFA Cup Final for the fifth consecutive season.

England international forward Elieen Foreman was Warminster's star player. Reg Foeman se up Warminster Town Ladies so that Eileen, his daughter and other goal to play football without the need to ravel to Weymouth, Bristol or Swindon.

Goals from Pat Chapman, Pauline Dickie and Pat Davies saw Southampton made an electrifying start and were 3-0 up within 25 minutes. Davies became the first player to score in three consecutive WFA Cup Finals. Foreman pulled one back for Warminster, but Southampton through Lynda Hale restored a three goal advantage before half-time. On the hour mark Foeman had the chance to reduce the arrears, when she became the first player to take a penalty in a WFA Cup Final. Unfortunately for her, Sue Buckett's

Southampton's goalkeeper became the first player to save one. Two minutes later Warminster were awarded a second penalty and this time Foreman made no mistake as she scored to make the score 4-2.

Reaching the final proved to be Warminster's greatest achievement. Sadly Reg Foreman was forced to stand down as manager in 1982 due to ill health and they folded in the mid-1980s. For Southampton, there were many more glorious days to come.
