Just 9 clubs competed in the second Leicestershire and Northants League competition.

Only referees who had passed examination set by the Leicestershire and Northamptonshire League were allowed to officiate League matches.

Northamptonshire were represented by three teams – Finedon Revellers, Kettering Reserves and Rushden Town Reserves. Wellingborough FC left the league at the end of the 1894-65 season and were replaced by Rushden Town Reserves.

Leicester YMCA, Melton Town and Sileby Rangers all left the League at the end of the inagural season.

Ashby and District, Hinckley and District, Leicester and District and North Leicestershire Leagues all started in 1895-9. These leagues sprung up owing to the success of the Leicestershire and Northants League.

Leicester Fosse Resereves were league Champions for the second time, losing just two (Hugglescote Riobin Hood and Coalville Town) of their 16 games.

It is worth noting that there are discepancies between the league table and the results grid constructed from published scores. For exmple, Leicester Fosse Reserves based on the above table W10, D2 and L4 compared with W9, D3 and L2 from published results There are several possible explanations – results were incorrectly reported, games were replayed and the results have no been found etc. However, it seems likely that the league tables would have been supplied by the League and not constructed by the newspapers, and as a consequence are most likely to be correct.

Shepsheds failed to complete their last two fixtures – against Coalville Town and Hugglescote Robin Hood...

Rusden were fined 10s and the League awarded Kettering 50s compensation for non-fulfilment of a fixture.

Shepshed were reported for the non-fulfilment of a fixture at Hugglescote. The League awarded Hugglescote £4 9s compensation.

At the end of the season several clubs complained about the great expense incurred in playing fixtures across two counties. Two Northamptonshire clubs stated their intention to withdraw from the League, with the Leicestershire clubs unanimously deciding, with the consent of the Leicestershire Association to form a Leicestershire Senior League to replace the leicestershire and Northants League.

At the annual general meeting of the Leicestershire and Northants League, held at the George Hotel, Leicester, six out of the nine clubs resigned from on account of the expense and time entailed in journeying from one county to the other, and decided to disband the League. The League's balance sheet at the end of the season showed receipts of £47 4s 4d., including gate money of the championship match, £30 8s 6d. the total on the expenditure side was £45 7s 1d., of huhc £9 1s 6d was for medals for the champions and the Rest of League; £13 16s 6d expenses incurred in connection with the championship match. the balance in hand was £1 17s 3d and after deducting incidental expenses it was decided to divide the remainder equally between the clubs of the League.







THE CHAMPIONS v REST OF THE LEAGUE

The customary championship match between the champions of the L and N League – who this year are again Leicester Fosse Reserves – and a team selected from the rest of the League was brought off today off on the Walnut-road Ground, Leicester, before a large attendance of spectators. An interesting game was anticipated, as the Fossils' Reserves put their best team in the field, whilst the team representative of the rest of the League was a very strong combination, and was under the captaincy of the veteran "Jimmy" Panter, of Kettering renown. The energetic secretary of the League, Mr John M Ferguson, was in charge of the whistle, the teams lining up as follows:

Rest of League: - Martin (Shepshed) goal; Toseland (Kettering) and H York (Finedon), backs; Patterson (Rushden), A B Panter, captain (Kettering), and Atkins (Hugglescote), half-backs; Hitchcock (Kettering) and Rice (Hugglescote), right wing; Kendrick (Coalville) centre; Narraway (Hinckley) and Cutler (Loughborough), left wing.

Fosse Reserves: Underwood, goal; Thompson and Hoga, backs; Cassell, Atherton and Bevans, half-backs; Pickard and Hibbard, right wing; Skea. Centre; McArthur and Bishop, left wing.

Linesmen, Messrs. W Reed (Hugglescote) and H T Dunn (Loughborough).

The Fosse won the toss and rushed the ball to the other end, but Martin saved finely. Each end was visited in turn, and the game became very fast, the Fosse having slightly the best of the play. Martin, however, kept his charge well. After half an hour's play the Rest of the league penned up the Fosse. A good centre by Cutler struck the corner of the post, and, rebounding, the same player banged it into the net. In the second half the Fosse had the best of the game, Skea scoring twice, McArthur once and Bishop once. Result:

LEICESTERSHIRE AND NORTHANTS LEAGUE

The annual general meeting of this League was held at the George Hotel, Leicester, on Tuesday, Mr. A. E. Marson presiding. Consequent on six out of the nine clubs forming the League having resigned on account of the expense and time entailed in travelling from one county to the other, it was decided to disband the League. Some discussion followed as to the formation of a League confined to Leicestershire, and eventually a suggestion that a League be formed, to include the Leicestershire senior clubs met with the entire approval of the Leicestershire representatives, and this course it was virtually understood would be adopted.— The balance-sheet showed receipts £47 4s. 4d., including gate money of the championship match, £30 8s. 6d. The total expenditure was £45 7s. 1d., of which £9 1s. 6d. was for medals for the champions and Rest of League this year, and £4 3s. 9d. for the same thing last year ; and £13 16s. 6d. expenses incurred in connection with the championship match. The balance in hand was £1 17s. 3d., and after deducting incidental expenses, it was decided to divide the remainder equally between the clubs of the League.—The Chairman presented Mr. Fergusson, on behalf of the League, with a handsome gold watch chain in recognition of his services as secretary during the past two years. — The presentation was suitably acknowledged by Mr. Fergusson.
