Emgals reach fourth round Leicester Emgals football team have reached the fourth round of the Pony Cup — the women's equivalent of the F.A. Cup. Playing on their own Emgals ground beat Bedford Catarans 4-0 to confirm their status as one of the top ten sides in the country. Two well taken goals by striker Maggi Miks put them in command before the interval and further goals by 'Tiggie' Eadie and defender Janet Hood clinched victory. Emgals, who were taken to a replay by City Transport in the previous round, have reached the closing stages of the cup for the last three years, but have never featured in the final. Now they reckon 1976-77 could be their year.
