The Senior League increased its membership by two in 1898-99, electing Loughborough Reserve, Swadlincote and Gresley Rovers, whilst Shepshed had resigned.

Mr W H Narris was elected League secretary in place of Mr Ferguson.

Anstey Town were fined 2s 6d for arriving late for a home League fixture with Swadlincote.

Anstey, Swadlincote, Loughborough and Whitwick were fined 2s 6d each for failing to send in match results within 4 days as per League rules.

The referee, Mr J E Carpenter, stopped the Loughborough game against Coalville Town played on the Athletic Ground Loughborough on Saturday 21 January 1899 before time due to "the conduct of spectators." After a thorough investigation the Council of the Leicestershire Football Association suspended Loughborough's Athletic Ground for 2 weeks and banned the club from playing matches within a radius of 6 miles. According to the report which Mr Carpenter made to the association, he had to stop the game after 42 minutes. From the commencement of the game the spectators were objectionable, but as play progressed their conduct became abusive, and the language was disgusting. He stopped the game once and went to the entrance where the officials were, and to them he called out and said that unless it was stopped the game would be abandoned. The state of the ground was bad, and so much so that Mr Carpenter had arrived at the point of declaring it unfit. After, however, he had stopped the game in the first instance to call attention to the conduct of the spectators, the annoyance continued so that whilst deciding that the ground was not fit, he had to decide also that the abusive conduct and language was such that he could not go on, and for those causes he stopped the match. Mr Carpenter further reported that he could see there was no attempt made to check the spectators. The referee appealed in vain for the language to be put down, and he eventually left the field in disgust, after having told the players the game was at an end. - *Leicester Journal* - Friday 27 January 1899

Gresley Rovers did not appear for a League match against Loughborough on 22 April 1900. For some inexplicable reason this fixture was not played.

Coalville v Barwell Swifts match on Saturday 22 April 1900 was abandoned in account of the non-appearance of the referee. The game was replayed the following week.

LEICESTERSHIRE SENIOR LEAGUE,

SERIOUS STATE OF AFFAIRS AT COAL-
VILLE.

LOUGHBOROUGH PLAYERS ROBBED.

There were only two matches in this League last Saturday, and both were in the colliery district. Whitwick Town were visited by Gresley Rovers, an even game just ending in the defeat of Whitwick by two goals to one. Their previous beating was also sustained at home by exactly the same score.

Loughborough Reserves took a very scrambling team to Coalville to play the Albion, and the official who accompanied the team comments very strongly on the treatment accorded the Loughborough players, who were as follows: Holmes, goal; Atterbury and Hisherley, backs; Stenson, Lambert, and West, half-backs; Mee, Monk, F. York, Tetbs, and Cutler, forwards.

The game was announced to start at 3.30, and Loughborough turned out to time, but the Albion were nowhere to be seen, and it was exactly 4.35 before they put in an appearance on the ground, Loughborough having had a game to themselves for over an hour. No explanation was forthcoming, and the game, in consequence of the excessive delay, was finished in semi-darkness, time being called at half-past six. Loughborough were, of course, considerably outplayed, and the game was a complete farce. Mason soon opened the scoring, and Jeffcoat followed with the second. Loughborough's defence, however, played a grand game, Holmes, in goal, giving a magnificent exhibi-

tion, while Atterbury, at back, cleared repeatedly, and showed up well. So well did the Loughborough defenders play, that Coalville did not score again until just before the whistle blew, the Albion only winning by three goals to none.

Upon arrival at the dressing-room (the headquarters of the Albion Club), the Loughborough official informs us, the players' clothes were all upset, and some money was said to have been abstracted. Atterbury complained of having been robbed of eight shillings, and Hitherley of 2s 6d., while Stenson sustained serious loss by having a silver match-box and two keys stolen. Fortunately, most of the players had given their money into the charge of the official, but one of their number left 30s in a purse in an inside pocket, which, fortunately, was not discovered.

This is a very serious matter, and the Loughborough club are making a report on it to the authorities. It is hoped the matter will be fathomed.

LOUGHBOROUGH RESERVES v. EARL SHILTON TOWN.

Played at Loughborough, before a poor gate. Shilton had the wind in the first half, and attacked, Holmes saving well. Then Loughborough showed much the better football, Mee frequently dropping the ball in front of goal, and after ten minutes' play Tebbs netted the ball for the first goal for Loughborough. Earl Shilton made several strong efforts, but their shooting was very poor, only goal kicks being forced. Ball played a good defensive game. Earl Shilton secured the first corner, but did not improve upon it. Mee put in some beautiful centres, from the right, and only just missed scoring. Loughborough then pressed strongly, and after Tebbs had shot over the bar the Shilton goal had a very narrow escape. Loughborough had nearly all the game up to the interval, but could not break through. The visitors only had one shot at the Loughborough goal in the last fifteen minutes of the first portion.

Shortly after resuming, Tebbs centred grandly, and Cutler shot sharply into the net for the second goal. A minute later Tebbs shot well at goal, the custodian saving. The Loughborough forwards were playing a capital game, and had ill-luck with several of their shots. Cutler shot exceedingly well, Armeson clearing. The Earl Shilton forwards spoiled whatever chances they possessed by getting off-side. Play slackened down for some time, but subsequently Loughborough livened up, and Tebbs scored a third goal, the custodian missing the ball. Earl Shilton managed to get away from a free kick, Pollard beating Holmes with a shot along the ground. The visitors played up strongly, and, through the Loughborough backs bungling, Coe got in a flying shot, which easily beat Holmes, the end coming immediately afterwards, with the score:

At Swadlincote, on heavy ground. Swadlincote won the toss, and had the wind and sun in their favour. Jones scored for them three minutes from the start, and they continued to have all the best of the game, but the visitors' defence was sound, the goalkeeper defending admirably. At half-time there had been no further score. Resuming, Webster, for Swadlincote, scored from a scrimmage. THE REFEREE STOPS THE GAME.

These teams met at Loughborough, in fearful weather, a strong gusty wind blowing, and heavy rain falling at times, whilst the ground was in a very greasy state. Coalville, getting off, led the attack, two shots going outside. Loughborough retaliated successfully, but the visitors, returning, kept up the pressure, and sent in several shots, Walker eventually scoring the first goal for Coalville. Directly afterwards, the visitors again attacked, and a shot from the centre went straight to Smith. The Loughborough goalkeeper stopped the ball, but could not hold it, and though he appeared to have cleared his goal, the referee thought otherwise, and gave Coalville their second point, much to the spectators' disgust. Play worked up and down, Coalville, aided by the wind, showing the most aggression. Brewin shot over the home goal, and Smith then had to give a corner to save, but the leather was cleared. The game continued chiefly in the home half, but a smart run by Barlowe and Hammond ended in Thornowell having to clear. A free given to Coalville for a foul caused some dissatisfaction amongst a little crowd in the enclosure, and when the referee awarded a free against G. Bexon, and cautioned him, a considerable amount of hooting and strong remarks came from the same quarter. Mr. Carpenter left the field, and informed the gatekeeper that if the behaviour of the spectators was continued he should stop the game. A few minutes later the game proceeded, and shortly afterwards Mr. Carpenter again gave a free against the same Bexon, and left the field once more, and went through the gates without saying a word to the officials. The game therefore, came to an abrupt ending shortly before half the time had been played. The decision of the referee and his action were freely and strongly commented upon by both players and spectators.

We learn officially that Mr. Carpenter stopped the game on account of the unruly behaviour of the crowd, and that the matter has been reported to the Football Association.

Additional Information

LEICESTERSHIRE SENIOR LEAGUE.

A special meeting of the representatives of the clubs belonging to this league was held at the George Hotel, Leicester, on Tuesday evening. Mr. J. E. Carpenter presided, and there were also present Messrs. J. M. Fergusson (hon. treasurer), W. E. Jones (hon. secretary), H. T. Dunn (Loughborough), and representatives of Nuneaton Town, Earl Shilton Town, Gresley Rovers, Hinckley Town, Swadlincote, Barwell Swifts, and Coalville Town.—The chief business was to consider the future of the league. The representatives of the various clubs expressed very strong opinions about the action of the Midland League in admitting Coalville Town and Hinckley Town to membership. It was felt that if this was sanctioned by the Football Association it would prevent the league being carried on. It was mentioned that Stockingford F.C. were prepared to apply for admission, and that Leicester Fosse Reserves would have joined but for the action of Hinckley and Coalville. Opinions were expressed that the league provided a competition for outlying clubs in Derbyshire as well as Leicestershire, and that both associations should support the continuance of an organisation mutually beneficial to their senior clubs.—Mr. Carpenter said the members of the management committee, who did not represent clubs, viz., Messrs. Dunn, Fergusson, Jones, and himself, preferred that the clubs should themselves decide what course to adopt. At the same time he intimated they were desirous of doing anything that was possible in the best interests of all concerned, and that the only point the officials felt strongly upon was the action of representatives of Hinckley Town, who had taken part in efforts to strengthen the league, and been parties to secure Stockingford F.C., and then without the slightest intimation seeking admission into another league.—Eventually it was decided that the secretary be instructed to appeal to the Football Association, pointing out that the extension in Leicestershire of the Midland League would mean the extinction of the Leicestershire League, and that the ground of the extension was already covered.

LEICESTERSHIRE SENIOR LEAGUE.

THE CLUBS AND THE ACTION OF THE LEAGUE.

The secretary of the Coalville Club writes :
" I think the opinion of all in the Coalville district, who take an interest in football, will be that the action of the Senior League authorities with regard to the admission of the Coalville and Hinckley clubs is anything but sportsmanlike. When a club tries to improve its status one would think that the leaders of football would rather encourage them to go on than endeavour to place obstacles in the way. The Leicestershire Senior League was not opposed to receiving Nuneaton and other clubs, if they could have had them, notwithstanding that it was the death-blow to the Coventry and North Warwickshire League, and when I mentioned this to Mr. Carpenter at the time, his reply was that the League referred to ' must look after itself.' The Leicestershire League must now do the same. In accepting additional clubs the Midland League have only done what the Leicestershire League would have done. Why, then, the distinction ?
