| 29.5.1950 | Hinckley Marquis Robins | 4 | 0 | Stanton Dynamos | "Comic football match" – Stoney Stanton carnival in aid of the War Memorial fund. |
| 18.9.1950 | Loughborough YMCA B Tomlyn (2) Joan Mills | 3 (1) | 0 (0) | Mountsorrel | Loughborough Women's Football Competition. Browns Lane, Loughborough. 1,680 spectators. Evening kick off. Loughborough were captained by 17 yr old Dorreen William and Mountsorrel by Hilda Curtis £42 raised for the Mayor's Appeal Fund for the YMCA. Tomlyn opened the scoring "with a shot that would have done any boy justice". |
| 25.9.1950 | Brush Engineering | 2 | 1 | Towles Paramount | Loughborough Women's Football Competition. Browns Lane, Loughborough. c. 2,000 spectators. "The crowd were thoroughly enjoying themselves cheering and laughing at the attempts of the girls in trying to control the ball on the slippery ground." |
| 2.10.1950 | Brush Engineering | 0 | 11 | Loughborough YMCA Jean Moore (6) Billie Tomlin (2) Janet Baker Dorreen William | Final Loughborough Women's Football Competition. Brown's Lane, Loughborough. 1,500 spectators. Mayoress of Loughborough (J Corah) kicked off and presented cups and medallions. Loughborough YMCA secretary suggested that the challenge cup donated by Mrs L Blackwell should be played annually. |
| 5.7.1952 | Brush Engineering | Р | Р | Towles (Loughborough) | Belvoir Drive, Leicester. Brush were unable to raise a team. |
| 25.7.1953 | | | | | Middlefield Lane ground Benefit game for Stan Tipton, Hinckley Athletic forward who broke his leg in October 1952 and was still in hospital. Teams chosen from women employees of the Leicester, Hinckley and Nuneaton garages of the Midland Red Bus Company. |
| ?.8.1953 | | | | | Bottleacre Lane, Loughborough. Six-a-side women's match at the annual sports day for employees of Herbert Morris. |
| ?.1.1954 | | | | | "Dressed in soccer kit, eight women employees of Mr J Rice and Sons Ltd, Syston, played a football match indoors at a works dinner and social event. The teams were drawing 1-1 when the male goalkeeper of one of the teams saved a certain goal with a flue brush." -Leicester Daily Mercury - Monday 25 January 1954 |
