Emgals again finished third after beating Thame in the 3rd Place Play-off, after being defeated in the semi-finals by Lee's Ladies from Scotland.

WFA secured Eton Park, home of Southern League Burton Albion for the final. Men's Football League clubs had again refused.

The 1972 final was a repeat of the first, apart from the fact that Stewartson Thistle had changed their name to Lee's Ladies following sponsorship by the local confectionary company, Lees Ltd. A brief match report was published in the Kilmarnock Standard: Stewartson Ladies were beaten in the women's Football Association Mitre Cup Final recently at Burton-on-Trent for the second year running by Southampton Ladies. In a hectic match which was accredit to both teams just failed to secure the equaliser in the closing minutes and final result was Southampton 3 Lees 2.

In the opening stages it was all Southampton and after 20 minutes they had scored two well-taken goals. Stewartson Lees pulled back almost immediately when Reilly crossed for Mary White to first-time the ball into the net.

Stewartson fought back strongly all through the second half but again Southampton scored first. Down 3-1 with only 20 minutes to play, Lees turned on the pressure and Susan Ferriers crashed home a great shot after beating two defenders.

This was the spur the Scottish team needed and from then until the final whistle they hammered the Southampton goal but without success. Lees deserved at least to draw for their fine team effort. They went down fighting. Lees Ladies: Chalmers; Brogan and Lindsay; Kidd, Hunter and Walker; Reilly, Lightbody, Ferriers, White and MacDonald. Subs: McCunnis and Howie.

The manager of Lees was Elsie Cook, a player with Stewartson the previous season, but not on the pitch this time as she was heavily pregnant.

Around 600 spectators witnessed a double-header with the third place play-off taking place immediately before the final. Emgals from Leicester beat Thame from Oxford on penalties after drawing 1-1 after 90

minutes. Emgals had themselves lost the previous year's third place match on penalties to the Wanderers of Nuneaton.
