Southampton suffered their first defeat in the competition after 4 years. In the closest final to date, Alison Leatherbarrow's winner for Fodens coming 4 minutes from time.

Fodens Ladies were founded in the 1950s out of the lorry manufacturing company, Fodens Ltd, based in Sandbach, Cheshire.

Prior to the final, Fodens had made a name for themselves in the Butlin's Cup, a series of tournaments (not sanctioned by the WFA) that were held at holiday camps round Britain. They beat Southampton 5-1 in the 1969 Butlin's Cup Final in Minehead, and held on to their title in Greenock the following year with a 1-0 win over Westthorn United. That victory over the Scots led some to referring to the Fodens as British champions.

Fodens went into the WFA Final unbeaten all season. Meanwhile, Southampton strengthened their position as England's leading club. At the start of the season they had been granted the use of Hampshire League men's side Totton United's ground, which aided their development.

For the second consecutive year, Bedford FC's Queens Park, staged the final. Fodens took the lead through a stunning 20 yard effort from Leatherbarrow which curled into the top corner. Southampton, in their white shirts and black shorts, equalised with as sharp left-footed shot from Pat Davies which flew into the net from 12 yards. With the match heading for extra time, Leatherbarrow struck the winner for Fodens with a 6 yard tap in 4 minutes from time.
