For a second consecutive year Southampton and QPR met in the final, but this time there was a different outcome as Rangers became the first London team to win the Cup. Brief highlights were broadcast the following weekend during Cup Final Grandstand on BBC1, as part of the build up to the men's final, in which Manchester United beat Liverpool 2-1. QPR's goalkeeper, Pat Napier was voted 'Player of the Match' and was presented with a bouquet of flowers by Mrs Ted Croker (wife of FA secretary). She also presented the medals and the Cup, which had a new sponsor – Pony, a product of the wine company Showerings. The sponsors also offered £100 to the winners. The only goal of the game was scored by 21 year old Carrie Staley after 25 minutes.

TWO goals from Hazel Ross put QPR Ladies into the final of the Women's Football Association Pony Cup on Sunday.

The Rangers girls dominated play during the early stages of this semi-final match at Moreton Town F.C. in Gloucestershire, and they went ahead after 30 minutes, when left-winger Hazel latched onto a through-ball, rounded Emgales 'keeper Diane Coombes, and tapped the ball home.

Leicestershire club Emgales equalised with a well-taken goal by Janine Dudgeon in the second-half, before Hazel Ross struck again for the Londoners with what proved to be the winner.

Rangers now go forward to meet Southampton Ladies in a repeat of last year's final, at Dulwich Hamlet F.C. on May 15.
