BELGRAVE ST. MICHAEL'S v. ENDERBY GRANITE.

This game was hotly contested on the Gipsy-lane Ground, the match having an important bearing on the championship of the League. Both teams had their full strength. Belgrave won the toss, and decided to face the wind in the first half. The game started somewhat exciting, inasmuch as Enderby broke away and scored. Not to be denied, the home eleven took up the attack, and pressed in determined fashion. Some rough play ensued, and the home team had a penalty given them, which Burgess placed to good account, and equalised the score. Half-time was soon after called, with the score:

ONE GOAL EACH.

The second half was commenced in vigorous fashion, but both sides were too eager, and lost several splendid openings through inferior shooting, the home team, however, being the greatest aggressors. The game continued in uninteresting fashion until the visitors' forwards executed a pretty bit of passing, by which means they reached the mouth of the home goal. Here St. Michael's were guilty of an infringement, and a penalty given against them, the shot striking the upright, and bounding over the bar. Following the goal kick St. Michael's rushed down, their backs keeping them well led. However, Enderby got the better of some tricky play, and from a "bully" in front of goal the Granite left wing scored a lovely goal with a fast rising shot. Re-starting, Belgrave came away in splendid style, but their skill was not finished enough to beat the visitors' defence. Result:

LEICESTER AND DISTRICT FOOTBALL LEAGUE.

The annual meeting of the above league was held at the Victoria Coffee-house on Friday, the following being present : Messrs F Gardiner (chairman), Baxter (Belgrave St Michaels), Cartwright (Blaby United), Salt (Enderby Granite), H. Watts (Market Harborough), Bourne (Ayleston Park Rovers), Ward (Syston Rangers), Sharp (Syston Swifts), Baille (Waverley), Wild (Wigston Excelsior), J W Carter and R H James (hon. secretary). The hon secretary and treasurer presented their reports, which were adopted, and a donation of a £1 is. was voted from the league to the fund being raised on behalf of the Whitwick Colliery disaster. Blaby United F.C. were re-elected under Rule 10. Applications to resign were received from Ayleston Park Rovers and Syston Rangers, which were accepted, and Ferndale F.C. and Glenn Parva Depot F.C. were elected to the vacancies. A vote of thanks was passed to the officials of the league for their services. The election of officials for next season included the following: President, Mr T. Seddon, vice-presidents, Mr. T. Brooks, (Barkby Hall), Captain Drummond (Enderby), Mr J. Johnson (Wigston), Allen Lovell, Sir John Rolleston, M. Spurway, Mr. O. Wright (Wigston), Mr W. W. Price, Mr. J. H. Douglass ; chairman and treasurer Mr. F. Gardiner, 41, Hinckley-road, hon. secretary, Mr. R. H. James, 20, Chaucer-street, emergency committee, Messrs. H. Bramley, T. Salt, J. W. Carter, R. W. Baxter, G. M. Sharp.
