SEMI-FINAL

KETTERING v LOUGHBOROUGH

At Kettering yesterday before one thousand spectators Kettering won the toss and attacked vigorously, the Loughborough custodian having to save twice in succession. Ten minutes from the interval Beaver gave Kettering the lead, and next minute Loughborough failed to turn a penalty kick account. The home team continued to have the best of matters in the second half but it was not until the last minute that Beaver added a second, Kettering winning by two to nil.

SEMI-FINAL ROUND

WELINGBOROUGH v RUSHDEN

Only a small attendance witnessed the meeting of these cubs at Kettering. Rushden had a strong wind behind them in the first half, and the weak defence of the Wellingborough backs allowed Dunkley to open the scoring for Rushden two minutes after the start. Before the interval, however, Williams, with a soft shot,

equalised. In the second half Raby have Wellingborough the lead but Hingerty equalised, and each side scoring again, the match ended in a draw of 3 goals each.

KETTERING CUP.

KETTERING v. RUSHDEN.

Played at Kettering before 2,000 spectators. Winning the toss Rushden scored a minute from the start, Kettering equalising four minutes later. Rushden pressed, but were driven back. The Rushden goal had several narrow escapes. Both teams had several fruitless corners, play slightly favouring Kettering. At the interval each side had scored once. Play was very fast in the second half. Kettering scored in eight minutes, and penned Rushden in. A fruitless penalty to Kettering was taken, who had much the best of the second moiety, Rushden only occasionally becoming dangerous. Result:—
