#28 SHIELD COMPETITION ENDERBY TOWN v ST MARY'S

At Enderby. After five minutes play Rowley scored for the homesters and quickly afterwards G West and Philips added another goal each. Fast play followed, but for the most part the ball was kept in the visitors' quarters. Ome good passing on both sides evoked the applause of a fairly large number of spectators, who, just before half-time was up, saw Phillips get the fourth goal for the village "boys". Early in the second half the town men made a vigorous attack, but experienced rather hard lines. While the Enderby goalkeeper saved a number of rapid shots in a praiseworthy manner, but was at last beaten by Gradwell, who, from a straight kick, opened account. After a little even play College, with a splendid long shot rase the Enderby score, and after a fine run up the ground. Nutt got the leather through again. St Mary's continued to play in a plucky manner, and gave White something to do. G West failed to score for the home team from a very good chance, but ere the whistle blew Phillips, who had previously obtained two goals added he seventh for his team, who this easily defeated St Mary's, with who they played a drawn game on the previous Saturday. These clubs met on the Athletic grounds in the third round of the Leicestershire Shield Competition. The visitors pressed at the outset, but were weak in shooting at goal, and the Excelsior, breaking away, scored through the goal-keeper leaving his charge to meet the ball, which he missed. Carr's equalised, but the home team had much the best of matters until half-time, when the score stood three goals to one in their favour. The greater portion of the second half was very evenly contested, and within a quarter of an hour of time nothing further had been registered. The Excelsior stayed better, and put on three goals in a very short time, the result being:
